Directions: Meet at the northern (main) parking lot for South Valley Park along South Valley Road just east of Valley Parkway. We will carpool to another site from there.

Details: Following a short stop to view hummingbird feeders (good chance for Calliope), this evening trip will have a rare opportunity to view a poorwill nest (adult incubating 7/16), and we will probably try to encounter calling and foraging poorwills after sunset. 1-2 miles of hiking on mostly gentle slopes.

Directions: Meet at parking lot adjoining the South Platte Reservoir. The reservoir is just north of Chatfield off of C-470. Take C-470 to the Wadsworth Blvd exit and turn north onto Wadsworth. Turn right (east) on West Chatfield Avenue and follow the road for 1.5 miles. Make a sharp turn right at the sign that says South Platte Reservoir and follow the access road around to the parking lot.

This will be an easy morning stroll around the ponds at South Platte Park. We will bird the ponds between South Platte Reservoir and the South Platte River south of Mineral Avenue and we will bird a short distance along the river. Possible avifauna include waterbirds, marsh birds, and species associated with riparian habitat. The trip includes an approximate walking distance of 3 miles on easy trails. We will begin and end at the last parking lot on South Platte Reservoir Access Road. **Register online or contact leader.**

Prospect Park, along the Wheatridge Greenbelt, includes fine riparian habitat along Clear Creek, some lakes and marshes. In any season there are a great variety of birds and often some surprises. The trip will involve walking 1-3 miles with some uphill through brush on a rugged trail. We'll see primarily breeding birds with possible early shorebird migrants. Bring binoculars, snacks, and water. Bring a scope if you have one. **Register online or contact leader.**

Directions: Meet at parking strip on north side of Ferril Lake. Directions: Enter park from Colorado Blvd. Northbound turns left onto 22nd Ave. past Museum of Nature & Science; southbound turns right onto 22nd at police station. Go past museum parking until road curves toward zoo. Take immediate left at "To Pavilion Bandstand" sign and go 300 yards down to corner with tall spruce trees, where lake comes into view. Park diagonally on left beneath spruces.

Because . . . why not? July-August may be the doldrums anywhere but the mountains, but a just-after-sunrise start before it gets hot (or stormy) may reveal unexpected birds in the middle of town. Cormorant, egret, and heron colonies are beginning to thin out after the mobs of spring and summer, but the park can still surprise. We'll walk 3-4 miles, end to end and back again. Bring water, a hat, snacks, and a capacity for wonder.

We will explore ponderosa pine woodlands for the end of the nesting season at this beautiful Jefferson County Open Space. We will meet and carpool to **Green Mountain Falls** (about one hour drive from meeting spot). Hike will be **4-mile** round trip with some elevation gain. We will see waterfalls and great scenery. Directions: From East Denver take 56th Ave east toward Pena Blvd. First Creek parking lot is just before Pena on your left (north). Or take I-70 east to Pena Blvd. Drive north to 56th Ave Exit. Turn left at the light and at the bottom of the off ramp, pass under the highway and turn right, almost immediately, into the First Creek parking lot.

We'll probably bird First Creek on both sides of Buckley Road, the Adams/Denver county dividing line. But we'll start on this still-new trail into the far east side of Rocky Mountain Arsenal NWR. Expect resident prairie grassland and cottonwood forest species along the creek, which leads to a cattail-lined pond and trees where hawks, owls and the occasional eagle hang out. After looping around that side, we'll catch the grassland-and-trees area north of the creek on the Denver side before walking east and upstream (time permitting) in First Creek @ DEN Open Space. Expect the unexpected -- early migrants going south, waterfowl in the creek, raptors in the skies. Dress for the weather, bring water and a hat, and expect to walk 3-4 miles on level gravel and paved trail. "Go before you go" at the King Soopers restrooms at 49th and Tower Road. Directions: Meet near the pavilion (Shelter C) behind the Goodson Recreation Center at deKoevend park. From S. University Blvd in Centennial turn west onto Goodson Rec Center Drive and follow the road to the parking lot behind the recreation center. We'll carpool to one or more locations along the High Line Canal Trail in the west Arapahoe County area (Littleton, Centennial, Greenwood Village, and/or Cherry Hills Village).

In west Arapahoe County, the High Line Canal Trail meanders around ponds, creeks, marshes, and open fields. These bodies of water and the riparian corridor along the canal itself provide rich habitat for local breeders, spring and fall migrants, and winter visitors. Specific birding locations will be chosen on the day of the trip, depending on what's around.
